As we prepared this list for 2019, our hearts were opened to CBM's partner-run projects that range from refugee children's camps in Lebanon, to the needs of women clergy in Cuba, to the victims of rape in a region where the prevalence of rape is the highest in the world.

Two food security projects that CBM runs with the Baptist Community of Central Africa.		
<i>Bugharama Village</i>	This project began in 2017 and in 2019 the focus is to build on that experience: multiply improved seeds to reach 200 farmers ; reinforce soil restoration; purchase seeds/cuttings; rehabilitate banana fields.	Tools and equipment - \$330; Seeds - \$2,150; Training - \$750; Transportation - \$180; Project coordinators - \$2,880; Professional services - \$200; Survey and monitoring - \$500; Project costs - \$510
<i>Kiliba</i>	Training 120 farmers about conservation agriculture and post-harvest techniques; fighting plant diseases; distribution of better seeds	Tools and equipment - \$1,420; Seeds - \$3,250; Training and workshops - \$920; Project coordinators - \$2,820; Equipment - \$400; Survey and monitoring - \$860; Project costs - \$540 ■
